COURSE INSTRUCTORS

Jonathan F. Bach, DVM, DACVIM, DACVECC

Dr. Bach has been a Clinical Assistant Professor at the University of Wisconsin since 2006. He earned his DVM from the University of Minnesota in 2000. After practicing for a year in Des Moines, Iowa, he did an internship at Wheat Ridge Animal Hospital in Denver, Colorado. Dr. Bach completed a small animal internal medicine residency, as well as an emergency/critical care fellowship, at Tufts University in Grafton, MA. He is boarded in both Internal Medicine (2005) and Emergency and Critical Care Medicine (2006). Since joining the UW in 2006 he has worked to expand the Emergency & Critical Care service overseeing a 24/7 ER & ICU as section head for the service, and coordinating four student courses. He also directs the Rotating Internship and ECC residency programs, the blood bank, and serves as faculty advisor for the UW chapter of SVECCS. When not having fun in the field of veterinary medicine, he loves having fun with his two young children or relaxing with his wife.

Jessica Diaz, DVM, MS

Jessica Diaz is a second year Emergency and Critical Care resident at the University of Wisconsin-Madison Veterinary-Medical Teaching Hospital. She completed her DVM and MS degrees at Michigan State University. Her small animal rotating internship was completed at Veterinary Specialists of South Florida. Her research interests include trends in culture isolates and antibiotic susceptibility in neutropenic chemotherapy canine patients.

Kelly Monaghan, DVM, DACVIM

Dr. Kelly Monaghan is a Clinical Instructor in the Small Animal Internal Medicine Department at the University of Wisconsin-Madison Veterinary Medical Teaching Hospital (VMTH). She joined the faculty in the fall of 2011 after completing her Internal Medicine Residency at Tufts University in Grafton, MA. Dr. Monaghan's clinical and research interest is in the field of nephrology and renal replacement therapy. Her recent research includes novel biomarkers of acute kidney injury (AKI) and pharmacokinetics of drugs in azotemic patients

and patients on dialysis. She recently started a dialysis program at the UW-VMTH using Continuous Renal Replacement Therapy for patients with AKI in December 2011.

Elke Rudloff, DVM, DACVECC

Dr. Rudloff is a 1991 graduate of Purdue University School of Veterinary Medicine. She completed her residency training at the Animal Emergency Center and achieved board certification in the American College of Veterinary Emergency and Critical Care in 1995. She has mentored 18 ACVECC Diplomates and is currently a clinical instructor and Director of Education at the Animal Emergency Center in Glendale, WI. She served as Regent for the ACVECC from 2000-2003 and as Scientific Program Chair for the Veterinary Emergency and Critical Care Society from 1997-2009. She is now the VECCS President. She is the 2008 recipient of the Ira Zaslow Award for distinguished service in the field of veterinary emergency and critical care and is an internationally recognized educator in the field of veterinary emergency and critical care. Her special interests include fluid resuscitation and trauma management, topics on which she has published in peer-reviewed journals and book chapters.

Elizabeth J. Thomovsky, DVM, MS, DACVECC

Elizabeth Thomovsky received her DVM degree from the University of Missouri-Columbia in 2001. She then completed a one year rotating small animal internship at the University of Illinois prior to practicing in two small animal clinics in southern Pennsylvania. In 2005 she returned to the University of Missouri for her Emergency and Critical Care residency and master's degree programs. Dr. Thomovsky successfully completed her requirements to become boarded in Emergency and Critical Care in 2008. She joined the faculty of the University of Wisconsin-Madison in October of 2008 where she worked as a clinical instructor until August of 2011. From there she took a position as a Clinical Assistant Professor of Small Animal Emergency and Critical Care at Purdue University's School of Veterinary Medicine where she is currently practicing.
