Application For License to Practice Veterinary Medicine – Code 050

- Available to graduates of AVMA accredited schools (who have passed the NAVLE) and others who have completed the Educational Commission for Foreign Veterinary Graduates (ECFVG) program of the AVMA. See Chapters VE 2 & 3 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code for additional requirements. Request NAVLE scores through AAVSB.org (American Association of Veterinary State Boards).
- This is a full, unlimited license, granted for fixed two-year periods, ending at the end of odd-numbered years. At this site http://drl.wi.gov/prof_docs_list.asp?profid=57&locid=0 download “Application Packet (Examination)” even if you have already taken the North American Veterinary License Exam (NAVLE).

Application For License to Practice Veterinary Medicine By Endorsement (for people licensed in other states) – Code 050

- Available to people licensed in other states of the US or provinces of Canada, provided they have actively practiced veterinary medicine for 4000 hours during the 5 years preceding application for this license and meet other criteria found in VE 4 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code.
- This is a full, unlimited license, granted for fixed two-year periods, ending at the end of the odd-numbered years. At this site http://drl.wi.gov/prof_docs_list.asp?profid=57&locid=0 download “Application Packet (Endorsement)” (for people licensed in other states).

Application for Post-Graduate Training Permit for Veterinary Medicine – Code 875

- Available to people who are undertaking intern or resident training at the University of Wisconsin School of Veterinary Medicine. See Chapter VE 5 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code for additional requirements.
- This is a limited license, permitting practice only within the scope of the training program and ending when the training program ends. Many trainees at the school who are not graduates of AVMA accredited schools select this type of permit. - Page 4 of this application must be signed by the Dean of the UW-Madison School of Veterinary Medicine. Becky Badimassoud will submit page 4 for the applicant separately.

Application for Veterinary Faculty License – Code 875

- Available to faculty employed at the University of Wisconsin, School of Veterinary Medicine. See Chapter VE 5 for additional requirements.
- This is a limited license, permitting practice only within the scope of employment at the School of Veterinary Medicine and ending when the employment ends. Faculty at the school who are not graduates of AVMA accredited schools often select this type of license. At this site http://drl.wi.gov/prof_docs_list.asp?profid=57&locid=0 download “Application Packet for Veterinary Faculty License”.
- Page 4 of this application must be signed by the Dean of the UW-Madison School of Veterinary Medicine. Becky Badimassoud will submit page 4 for the applicant separately.

TIPS FOR APPLYING FOR A LICENSE IN WISCONSIN

- Complete your application promptly and mail it to the P.O. Box found on all applications. **Where it asks for postgraduate experience, account for every month since earning your veterinary degree. Incomplete information will slow the application process.**
- Payment may be by personal check or money order, but not by credit card.
- Monitor this site <http://online.drl.wi.gov/ApplicationStatus/CredentialApplicationStatus.aspx> (Application Status) to learn when processing of your application has begun. At this point you may take the online examination on laws, a requirement for all applicants regardless of type of license or permit applied for.
- Continue to monitor your application status to learn whether your application is considered complete. Respond promptly to requests for more information.
